Course Title: PS03 Family Life (3 units)

Course Description:

This course is a study of the biblical design for marriage and the family. It focuses on preparing the individual for marriage and family life by giving special attention to premarital factors and relations, mate selection, adjustment, family member status and role, socialization process, social control, change of family structure, and social class and mobility aspects. It aims to help improve the family dynamics of Filipino families and build strong and healthy relationships.

Course Pre-requisite: none

Course Learning Outcomes: At the end of the course, the students should have:

- Identified fundamentals of sexual purity in a person's dating life.
- Demonstrated knowledge of Christian perspectives and principles of marriage and the family, including specific biblical teachings pertaining to it.
- Developed a strategy for building family cohesion and strength through appropriate involvement and support.
- Conducted a webinar on love, courtship, and marriage.

SKILLS

- Drawn God's blueprint for marriage and family based on Scriptures.
- Utilized appropriate methods of conflict resolution and decision-making.

VALUES

- Evaluated their own maturity and readiness for marriage.
- Displayed an appreciation of the importance of marriage and families for the personal and social wellbeing of human life.
- Committed to sexual purity before and in marriage.
- Made a resolve in relation to family planning.

Course Procedures

Throughout this course, a number of methods will be used to engage the students in learning and processing information, interacting with other students, and applying the learning to their lives. (see Course Requirements for details)

LATE ASSIGNMENT POLICY

Course Requirements

Reflective Blog

In each topic the student's appreciation for and understanding of the important content issues and concepts will be assessed by means of a reflective blog. Students are asked to write about the 2 most important things that they learned in each topic, and how they think the knowledge they are gaining from the topic will impact their values, attitudes, beliefs and behavior. After they submit their blog, they are required to respond to the blogs submitted by 2 of their classmates.

Discussion Forums

Student-led Discussions: Every two weeks a group of students will be assigned to lead 2 different discussion forums. Each forum covers one topic. For each topic forum the assigned students must ask one original "critical thinking" question. Other students will respond to these questions, and Discussion Forum Facilitators (DFFs) will then reply back to those students. Each DFF will lead his or her own discussion thread. The DFFs are encouraged to keep up these "virtual discussions" all throughout the two weeks. The idea here is for each student to lead one discussion with the other students about some important and/or controversial issue introduced in each topic, and participate in additional discussions for each topic. These threads are graded based on clarity and organization of post, critical thinking, and word count/grammar. If a discussion gets off track, it is the responsibility of the DFF to refocus it. The DFFs are responsible for maintaining the quality of the discussion.

Purity Webinar

The class shall organize a webinar on love, courtship and marriage. The class plans and designs the webinar including content, implementation and evaluation.
